Wallace and Dorothy Andrews created this scholarship in 2011 to help young people pursue their dreams in a scientific field. It is awarded to African-American students who major in Bioscience, Mathematics, Engineering, or Physics.

Wallace grew up in the rural South in the early 1960's. Going to college was a financial challenge, but he enrolled at Norfolk State University in Virginia. He majored in Physics, and was surprised to hear many of his teachers suggest a different career, one "better suited to African-Americans" — at the time, there were only three African-Americans, with advanced degrees in science, working in our National Laboratories. Wallace stayed true to his chosen field and graduated with a B.S in Physics. He later obtained a Master's of Science from Lesley College in Boston before attending Divinity School and serving in the Ministry for 25 years.

In 2000, Wallace founded InterGlobal Communication Group in Worcester. His company serves the medical industry by providing consulting, technology, services and outsourcing to major health organizations. Wallace and Dorothy live in Hudson, MA.
